## NOVEMBER CLASS INFO

FOLDED STAR CHRISTMAS  
DECORATION

3 DISTINCT COLORS OF FABRIC- Need materials which will not blend together. Cut twenty-four (24) 2" squares of each color. Make one choice a solid color.

Straight pins- at least 300.

Ribbon 1/8" wide ( an assortment of colors will be available).

Lace or decorative trim at least 1 yd. long. Must be at least 5/8" wide. You should not be able to see thru the lace. Can use satin or velvet ribbon, but not on the first ornament.

3" Styrofoam ball

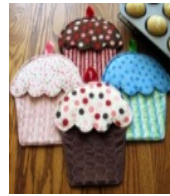
3 pearl corsage pins

Pair of scissors and a pencil.

### MATERIALS:

Cotton fabrics will work best, but other fabrics can be used. For the first Christmas ornament, please use cotton to learn the technique. Pearls and artificial flowers may be added later.

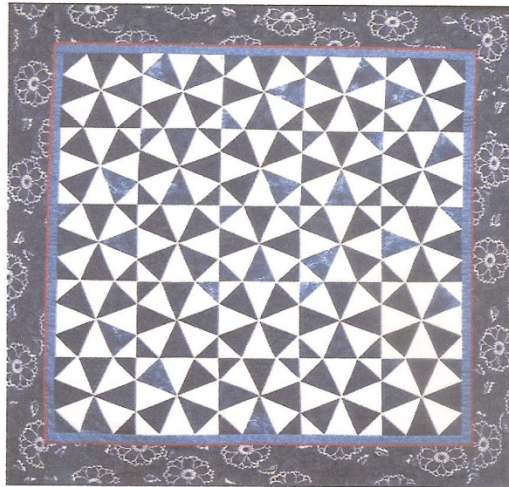
